Patricia Green Cellars Sauvignon Blanc

The silver/straw-colored 2023 Sauvignon Blanc is perfumed and expressive with notes of salted grapefruit, tropical flowers, candied citrus, ripe peaches, and fresh dewy earth. Medium-bodied, it's juicy and pretty, with ripe acidity and a clean finish. It's a lovely and elegant Sauvignon Blanc to enjoy over the next 2-4 years.

Fermented and aged in acacia puncheon barrels, the 2023 Sauvignon Blanc Estate Vineyard comes from the oldest Sauvignon Blanc vines in the Willamette Valley. Silver/straw-colored, it opens to very detailed and elegant tropical notes of fresh guava, basil, preserved citrus, and pretty flowers. Medium-bodied, with a delicate, rounded feel, it's energetic and very pretty, with mouthwatering, salty, fresh acidity and a perfumed finish. It's elegant and remains refreshing. Drink over the next 5-6 years.

The last year for this cuvée, the 2022 Pinot Noir Anderson Family Vineyard pours a bright medium red color and is very pretty on the nose, with ripe wild raspberries, candied flowers, sweet herbs, and a hint of leather. Medium-bodied, it carries lovely intensity and extract on the palate, with a very pure and linear feel that's focused and lovely. Offering a lot of vibrant, ripe, crunchy fresh fruit, it's a highly pleasurable wine to drink over the next 10 or more years.

The 2022 Pinot Noir Balcombe Vineyard is a bright magenta/ruby hue and reveals notes of darker baking spices, cardamom, a fresh floral perfume, and black raspberries. It's highly elegant on the palate, with seamless, supple tannins, ripe acidity, and harmony all the way through. A quintessential Dundee Hills red, it's approachable now but will have a wide drinking window over the coming 10–15 years.

A jeweled red hue, the 2022 Pinot Noir Balcombe Vineyard Block 18 has a bit more high-toned spice coming through over the darker pure fruit and is a touch more introspective in character, with a slightly more savory profile including darker cherries. The wine has a good deal of intensity and a more noble structure, with a sanguine, lightly gamey earth note through the finish. Drink 2026–2040.

The defining wine of 2022, coming from the Anderson Valley in California, the 2022 Pinot Noir Bearwallow Vineyard is a bright ruby color and is lifted with savory fresh herbs, pine, conifer spices, pomegranate, rhubarb, and spiced orange peel. Bright and linear, it's energetic and focused, with citrus drive on the palate, fine tannins, and a clean, zesty finish. It's refreshing and vibrant but has a lot to offer. Drink 2024–2037.

Jeweled ruby/magenta in color, the 2022 Pinot Noir Chehalem Mountain Vineyard is perfumed and floral on the nose, with fresh notes of ripe black raspberries, violets, sweet sage, fresh earth, and a hint of umami. The palate has a lot of purity and a crystalline, ripe feel, with a hint of delicate richness coming through. More red-fruited than the 2021, the inclusion of some Calera and Dijon clones gives it its textural component, and it has ripe tannins and a long finish. Drink 2025–2040.

Wadensvil Clone

Coming from the steeper site of the vineyard, the 2022 Pinot Noir Chehalem Mountain Vineyard Wadensvil Clone is a jeweled ruby hue and is expressive in the glass, with notes of rocky earth, ripe raspberries, pretty spice, wildflowers, saline, and mushroomy earth. It has a chiseled structure and persistent length, with its red fruit shining through. Drink 2026–2040.

The 2022 Pinot Noir Corrine Vineyard Anklebreaker Block is a deeper ruby hue and reveals a savory umami tone, with hints of porcini, dark berries, rocky earth, and forest earth. Medium-bodied, it fills the palate with vibrant energy and fresh, mouthwatering acidity and structure. It's a fantastic wine with a lot of complexity. Drink it over the coming 15 or more years.

A youthful ruby/magenta wine from 32-year-old vines, the 2022 Pinot Noir Corrine Vineyard Wadensvil Block offers aromas of dark stones, wild herbs, and brambly black raspberries. It has a good deal of intensity on the palate, with a medium frame, great energy, and a fantastic crystalline feel. It's a stunning wine. Unfortunately, the vineyard has phylloxera and has to be replanted, but boy, this is one to get a hold of while it's here. A next-level red from Patricia Green, I want to snatch up a bunch of this. Drink 2025–2045.

Once coming from the old Hope Well Vineyard before they gave it to Bledsoe, the 2022 Pinot Noir Coulee Vineyard is a rich ruby hue and is expressive of preserved cherries, rosemary, and forest floor. Medium to full-bodied, it expands on the palate and is more broadly shouldered, with chalky, grained tannins and a long, savory finish with a bit of toast. It's a more robust wine in terms of its structure but remains well-balanced. Drink 2025–2037.

This is an exceptional wine from Patricia Green Cellars, and it's going to age with ease, but has a really great feel now.

It feels lightweight upfront, but it has real tension in its underlying coiled tannins, while on the back palate, it has fantastic mineral drive. It should age with ease over the long haul and expand with time. Drink 2025–2040.

The 2022 Pinot Noir Freedom Hill Vineyard Wadensvil Clone has a spicier nose of pine resin and is lifted and bright on the palate. More linear and focused, it's tension-packed with coiled acidity and persistent drive throughout the palate, as well as more citrus. It's going to age well and deserves another couple of years in the cellar.

A lovely, seamless wine, with a plush tannin structure, even acidity, a very supple texture, and a floating finish with a lightly salty, mineral iron tone, it feels more approachable now but should have a wide drinking window. Drink 2024–2038.

It has a more chiseled structure and a ripe, very appealing texture, and its ripe kiss of sweet fruit is seamless and long. Drink 2025–2040.

This seems to be the last vintage for the 2022 Pinot Noir Mysterious Arcus Vineyard, which is profound and gains intensity on the nose, with notes of toasted cedar, ripe cherries, pie spices, and crushed pine needles. Pure and fresh, it feels more noble on the nose, but there is great electric energy on the palate, with ripe fruit and a long, mouthwatering, salty finish. I love the crunchy, angular feel of this wine, and it has a lot going on. Drink 2026–2046.

The 2022 Pinot Noir Notorious boasts ripe wild raspberry and kirsch, as well as sweet spices, forest earth, and ripe fruit. It has fantastic ripeness and depth, with a long, lightly savory finish. It's a really mouthwatering red, but it has that rounded richness that wraps around it. Drink 2026–2046.

The bright ruby 2022 Pinot Noir Reserve is floral and pretty on the nose, with lots of fresh flowers, grenadine, a fine spice, and dusty earth. Medium-bodied, it fills the palate with a plush, ripe tannins, even acidity, and a light savory finish with delicate notes of tea leaf. It's approachable now but is going to drink well over the coming 8–10 years. I like the savory note that comes through on the finish as well as the sweet ripe fruit.

It's linear, lifted, and refreshing on the palate and has a pastoral feel, with fine tannins and a note of dewy fresh earth. It's drinking beautifully now and will drink well over the coming 10–12 years. I really love the freshness of this.

The 2022 Pinot Noir Wind Ridge Vineyard is a pretty ruby hue in the glass and lifts with very pretty notes of wild fresh berries, grenadine, candied flowers, and lifted spice. With ripe tannins and a gravelly texture, this very appealing wine is going to improve with another year. Drink over the next 10–15 years.
